Pronunciation

aa [a:], **ae** [ɛ], **aue** [aʊ], **ch** [tɕ], **ia** [iə], **ng** [ŋ], **ny** [ŋ]~[ɲ], **oa** [ɔ], **oe** [ə], **ua** [uə], **ue** [ʊ], **uea** [ʊə].

Tone is determined by the class of the initial character and the tone mark which in romanization are combined into one diacritic above the vowel:

<i>Initial character</i>	<i>Without tone mark</i>	<i>Tone mark 1</i>	<i>Tone mark 2</i>
<i>low</i>	Tone 1 (a)	Tone 2 (á)	Tone 3 (à)
<i>high</i>	Tone 4 (ā)	Tone 5 (â)	Tone 6 (ǎ)

Notes

1. Tai Dam or Black Tai (ᨆᨑᨗ ᨆᨑᨗ *Tāi Dam*) is written in Tai Viet script; the script is also used for Tai Don (White Tai) and Tai Daeng (Red Tai).
2. In Tai Viet script words are usually not separated but in romanization lexemes may be divided. Should there be a space in Tai Viet, it could be denoted by a middle dot after the preceding word.
