II. Vowel characters (ກ stands for any consonant character)

The tones were earlier (1956–1988) denoted by diacritics: 2 ແ, 3 ສ, 4 ຄ, 5 ກ, 6 ຂ. Tone marks are written at the end of a syllable.

Pronunciation

aa [ɑ:], **ae** [ɛ], **aue** [aʊ], **aw** [ɔ], **ng** [ŋ], **oe** [ə], **ue** [w], **x** [x], **y** [j], **'** [?].

Tones: 1 middle [33], 2 high level [55, ˥], 3 low level [11], 4 low falling [31], 5 high falling [53, ˥˧], 6 rising [35, ˧˥].

Notes

1. Tai Nüa or Dehong Dai (ເທິ່ງພຕົມ ອລອນ ພ້າ ພ້າວເຂອງ or ເທິ່ງພຕົມ ພຸລີ ພ້າ ພ້າວເຂອງ) is written in Tai Le script that has been improved in the 1950's and 1980's.
2. If a consonant has no vowel character, it is pronounced syllable-initially with an inherent [a] and syllable-finally without a vowel.
3. Tai Nüa has no consonant combinations, syllable-final sounds are *ue*, *i*, *u*, *m*, *n*, *ng*, *p*, *t*, *k*; diphthongs ending in *u* (*aa*, *ae*, *au*, *eu*, *iu*, *oeu*) are spelled with consonant *o* *w*.
4. In Tai Le script words are usually not separated but in romanization lexemes may be divided. Should there be a space in Tai Le, it could be denoted by a middle dot after the preceding word.
