Origin of the system

The United Nations recommended system was approved in 1977 (III/11), based on the romanization of the Serbo-Croatian Cyrillic alphabet that had long been employed in official gazetteers and maps of Yugoslavia. The table was published as annex to the resolution¹.

Implementation

The system is used in Yugoslavia, in Bosnia and Herzegovina, and in international cartographic products.

Brief characterization

Serbo-Croatian (Serbian) uses the Cyrillic script which is alphabetic. The romanization table is unambiguous and can be applied automatically. The system is reversible.
